Salt Lake Acting Company's 45th Season Opens with **BLACKBERRY WINTER**

"Because memories are the tiniest, most fragile of things, they hardly take up any space at all. But in just a raindrop full, lifetimes are held for the reminiscing."

Salt Lake Acting Company (SLAC), opens its 45th season of brave contemporary theatre with the National New Play Network Rolling World Premiere of BLACKBERRY WINTER by Steve Yockey.

BLACKBERRY WINTER is a touching and heartfelt story about one woman's coming to terms with the disease that is claiming her mother. Years of success, meticulous planning, and an eye for detail have in no way prepared Vivienne Avery for her mother's slide into the grip of dementia. With her ever-present polite smile and hospitality, Vivienne leads the audience on a funny, emotional journey through insomnia-fueled baking, stories of her mother, and a childlike Alzheimer's creation myth. BLACKBERRY WINTER is an all-too-relatable story about loving and letting go.

Playwright Steve Yockey says: "The play explores one woman's journey navigating the landscape of her mother's failing health and coming face to face with grief. Sometimes that's funny because it has to be, sometimes it's also quite sad because it has to be. If nothing else, I hope it's unsparingly honest."

Salt Lake Acting Company is a proud member of the National New Play Network (NNPN), which is the country's alliance of nonprofit theaters that champions the development, production, and continued life of new plays. BLACKBERRY WINTER is receiving the Network's largest ever Rolling World Premiere, with its first production at Salt Lake Acting Company to be followed by another six productions nationwide: Actor's Express - Atlanta, GA - November 6-22, 2015 (co-production with Out of Hand Theatre); Capital Stage - Sacramento, CA - March 16 - April 17, 2016; New Repertory Theatre - Boston, MA - March 26 - April 17, 2016; Oregon Contemporary Theatre - Eugene, OR - April 15 - May 7, 2016; Kitchen Dog Theater - Dallas, TX - May 20 - June 25, 2016, Forum Theatre - Washington, DC - dates not yet announced. SLAC is very proud to be kicking off this unprecedented Rolling World Premiere.

NNPN Executive Director Nan Barnett says: "Steve Yockey has become one of National New Play Network's favorite playwrights as evidenced by the NNPN Rolling World Premiere of BLACKBERRY WINTER. With eight partnering theaters set to produce the play within the twelve months following its opening at SLAC, it has officially become the largest RWP in the history of the program, and, as it is Steve's fourth play to receive one, he has become our most produced playwright. Its smart, honest, startlingly funny look at the life of someone caring for a loved one with a deteriorating memory so moved NNPN's artistic leaders that the play was designated for a roll - created when three or more member theaters decide to work collaboratively with a playwright on separate and distinct productions of a new play - almost immediately following its reading at the 2014 National Showcase of New Plays. We believe that this work epitomizes the Network's dedication to the development, production and continued life of new works and look forward to seeing it in the future as theaters across the country continue to produce it long after the roll is completed."

SLAC's production features a cast of local actors each making his or her Salt Lake Acting Company debut: April Fossen as Vivienne Avery, S.A. Rogers as Gray Mole, and Kalika Rose as White Egret. University of Utah professor Sandra Shotwell will direct the production.

In creating a magical world for Vivienne's Alzheimer's 'creation myth,' SLAC has enlisted the help of two puppet experts. Glenn and Linda Brown are former theatre professors at the University of Utah and recently returned after a worldwide adventure teaching puppetry and theatre. The Browns are thrilled to be the first puppeteers to bring shadow puppetry to SLAC. They will be presenting this ancient art form using old technology, in a new way.

Using personalized playlists of favorite songs loaded on iPods, this proven program reawakens memory in people suffering with Alzheimer's, dementia and other cognitive and physical disabilities.

<u>SLAC will be launching the first of a city-wide iPod drop</u> - collecting gently used donated iPods throughout the run of BLACKBERRY WINTER. All donated iPods will go directly to residents in a Music & Memory Certified Nursing Home.

SLAC will also present a <u>free screening of Alive Inside: The Story of Music and Memory on September 28 @</u> <u>7pm</u> followed by a panel discussion featuring Geralyn White Dreyfous, Ellen Fisher, Mary Ellen Geist, Gerda Saunders, and Anne E. Palmer.

SLAC maintains an active gallery to showcase and sell the work of local visual artists in rotating exhibitions inspired by productions on our stage. This season, SLAC is proud to partner with Art Access for our Green Room exhibitions. During the run of BLACKBERRY WINTER, audiences will have the chance to enjoy artwork created by patients and caregivers affected by Alzheimer's disease.

PLAYWRIGHT

Steve Yockey is a Los Angeles based writer with work produced throughout the country, Europe, and Asia. His plays AFTERLIFE, OCTOPUS, LARGE ANIMAL GAMES, CARTOON, SUBCULTURE, VERY STILL & HARD TO SEE, THE FISHERMAN'S WIFE, WOLVES, DISASSEMBLY, and NIAGARA FALLS & OTHER PLAYS are published and available from Samuel French. He was one of two writers selected for the US/Australia playwright exchange in February 2013, sponsored by National New Play Network and Playwriting Australia. Steve holds an MFA in Dramatic Writing from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts. He currently contributes issues to the Zenescope comic book series *Grimm Tales of Terror* and writes for HBO's *The Brink*.

Sandra Shotwell has an MFA in Acting from The American Conservatory Theater in San Francisco, an Advanced Diploma in Voice and Speech (ADVS) with Distinction from the Central School of Speech and Drama in London, and is a certified Laban-Bartenieff Movement Analyst (CLMA).
