FOURTH STREET CLINIC

HOMELESSNESS HURTS. HEALTH CARE HELPS.

Fourth Street Clinic helps individuals experiencing homelessness improve their health and quality of life by providing high-quality integrated health care.

For many homeless Utahns, Fourth Street Clinic is their first and only chance at a diagnosis and on-going treatment. By increasing homeless Utahns' access to primary care, Fourth Street Clinic is a major partner in ending homelessness, promoting community health, and achieving across-the-board health care savings.

Fourth Street Clinic serves over 5,000 homeless men, women and children each year – with 25,000 medical, mental health, substance abuse, dental, and case management visits in 2017.

The Inn Between provides medical respite and end-of-life care for those experiencing homelessness In Salt Lake City streets.



Prior to The Inn Between, no adequate solution existed for housing terminally ill and medically frail homeless people, resulting in an average of 50 deaths on Salt Lake area streets annually.

Today, those numbers are higher.

The need for this work is critical. We adhere to the hospice philosophy of providing care for the sick, especially the terminally ill, and treating the whole person by providing support for their emotional, social, and spiritual needs, not simply the medical symptoms. The INN Between is not a licensed hospice or medical providerour home is the critical missing link for individuals who don't have access to hospice or medical care simply because they lack housing.

SARAH SHIPPOBOTHAM (Dialect Coach)

is an actor, dialect coach, intimacy consultant, and Professor in Acting, and Dialects at the University of Utah. Sarah trained as a Voice and Dialect Coach at The Central School of Speech and Drama in London. Her work as Dialect Coach for PTC includes Firelflies, Once, Miss Bennet: Christmas at Pemberley, Sweeney Todd: The Demon Barber of Fleet Street, Oslo, The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time, The Last Ship, and Oliver! Other Dialect/Voice coaching credits include eighteen seasons with the Shaw Festival (Canada) and shows for Salt Lake Acting Company including Sleeping Giant and Passing Strange.



PHILIP RIDLEY (Playwright) is an artist, playwright, screenwriter, and novelist. He was born in London and studied Art at St Martin's School of Art and his art work has been exhibited throughout Europe and Japan. As a student he made several short art films, including **Visiting Mr. Beak**.

He wrote the acclaimed screenplay for the feature film, **The Krays** (1997), and wrote and directed the films **The Passion of Darkly Noon** and **The Reflecting Skin** (both included in The American Dreams, 1997) and the short film, **The Universe of Dermot Finn**. He also co-wrote two songs for **The Passion of Darkly Noon**.

He has written radio plays for the BBC and several stage plays. His plays for adults include: The **Pitchfork Disney** (1991); **The Fastest Clock in the Universe** (1992), which gained him several major awards; **Ghost from a Perfect Place** (1994); **Vincent River** (2000); and **Mercury Fur** (2005). His plays for children include: **Karamazoo**, **Moonfleece**, **Fairytaleheart** and **Sparkleshark** (both included in Two Plays for Young People, 1998); and **Brokenville** (2001).

Philip Ridley's fiction for adults comprises of three novels: **Crocodilia** (1988); **In the Eyes of Mr. Fury** (1989); and **Flamingoes in Orbit** (1990). His children's books concentrate on topical issues such as bullying, family breakdown and homelessness. These books include **Krindlekrax** (1991), which won the Smarties Prize and the WHSMith mind-Boggling Book Award and was later adapted for the stage by the author; **Scribbleboy** (1997); **ZinderZunder** (1998); **Vinegar Street** (2000), and **Zip's Apollo** (2005).
